## WHAT TO EXPECT ON THE DAY OF MEASUREMENTS

- The Technician will perform the following measurements of your eyes:
  - o Axial length,
  - o Anterior chamber depth,
  - o Lens thickness,
  - o Corneal diameter.
- Topography (corneal mapping) of both eyes, if applicable.
- If history of refractive surgery (i.e. Lasik, PRK, RK) then extra measurements will need to be taken due to the increased complexity.
- In the exam room the technician will look over all information and discuss your lens options.
- Once the options have been finalized, the technician will fill out the consent form for both eyes (if applicable). If monovision is requested, the desired focal point (distance or near) will be noted on the form.
- Pre and post-operative drops will be discussed, with the option of going through your pharmacy or having them compounded.
- Limitations after the surgery and post-op appointments will be discussed.
- All the above information will be noted in the surgical plan.
- The cataract exam will be completed consisting of vision, pressure check and dilation. It
  is required to be dilated at the time you see your surgeon. If you are uncomfortable
  driving, please coordinate with someone to drive you home.
- You will then see the doctor, where he or she will look over the surgical plan (making any necessary changes). A physical will be performed, unless it is determined that you need clearance by your PCP.
- You will then see our surgery schedulers, where you will be scheduled for both eyes (if applicable).
